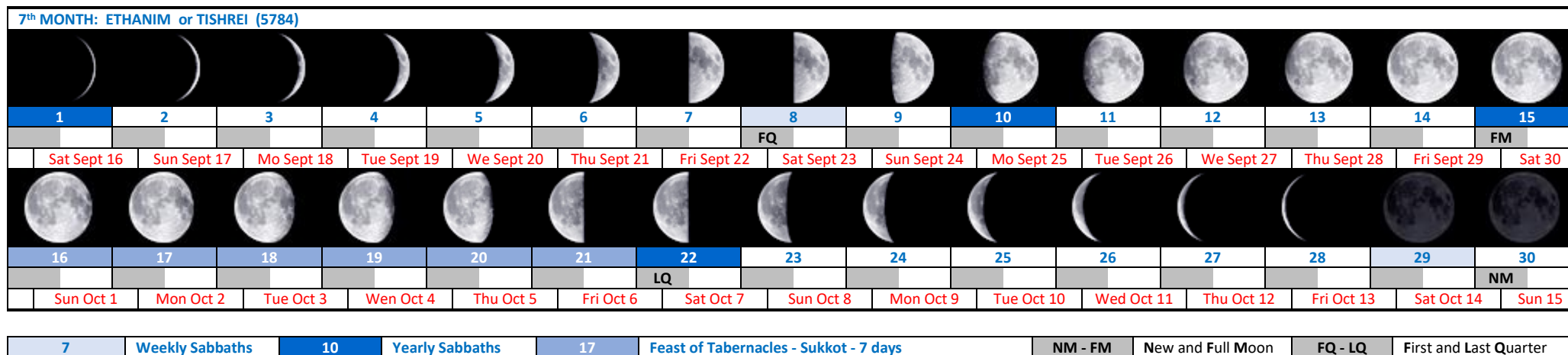

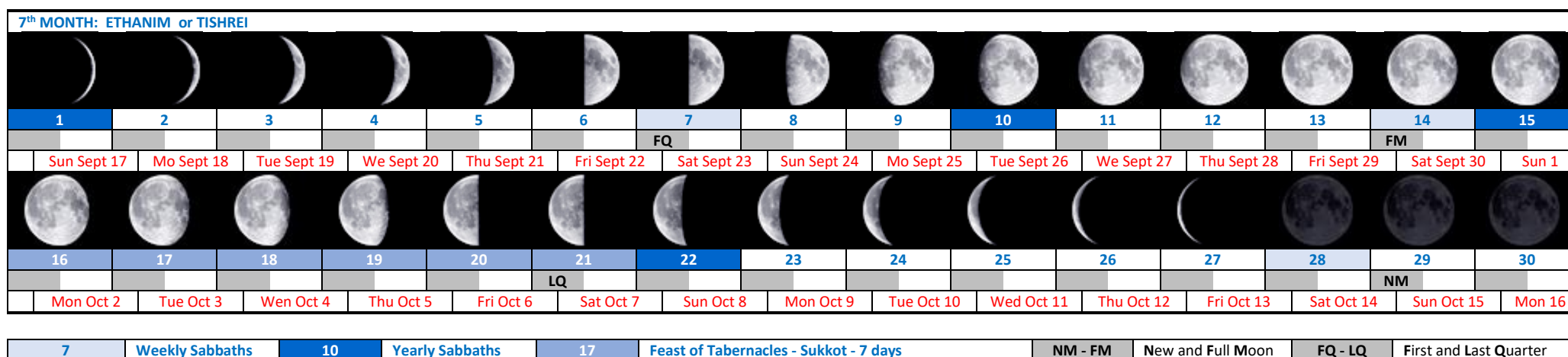

God's calendar and the Jewish calendar coincide on the same days for Passover 2023. As in the last year of Jesus' life, the 14th of Nisan falls on a Wednesday and the "first Sabbath" on the 17th of Nisan.

Note: On September 15/16 and October 15/16 the first crescent moon (the new light) cannot yet be detected over Jerusalem. The light of the moon increases but is not visible until the following night. In the Jewish calendar, the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur, Tishrei 10) is thus celebrated one day too early; the priest would die if he entered the Holy of Holies in the Jerusalem Temple on this day.

Note: The above figures show the biblical feast days 2023 according to the specifications in today's **Jewish calendar** following Hillel, which was invented only in the 4th century AD, when the Israelites scattered all over the world could no longer see the first crescent moon over Jerusalem. The Jewish calendar is based on statistical averages, not always paying attention to the crescent moon. This explains why some Jewish months start already at invisible crescent moon (new moon). But the **Calendar of God** mentioned in the Bible is a purely astronomical calendar, where the first day of the month always begins with the first visible crescent moon over Jerusalem, so with the so-called [new light](#). Therefore, the actual feast days in the Calendar of God can deviate in some years around 1-3 days (in a leap year even around nearly one month) from the Jewish calendar. In 2023, the first three feast days (High Sabbaths) fall on the same days in both calendars; thus, the counting of the 50 days to Pentecost can be easily viewed in any online Jewish calendar. In the 7th month, the correct Day of Trumpets (Yom Teruah) is Sunday, September 17 (not Saturday, Sept. 16). The lunisolar calendar of God mentioned in the Bible is sensational, because it connects all months with the exact moon phases and the development of the plants (nature, agriculture) in the whole course of the year to a harmonious unity. The biblical spring and autumn festivals are always in the area of the equinox. The harvest times at the festivals symbolize the course of the spiritual harvest of the different groups of people in the 7,000-year plan of God. The first spiritual harvest (spring to summer harvest at Pentecost) are the firstfruits (the Bride of Christ); they are the first called who have love and follow the Lamb (Jesus) wherever He goes and who have separated themselves from the sins and habits of the world. The main harvest in the fall with the last 4 feast days (High Sabbaths) symbolizes the great spiritual harvest of the other groups of people who lived during the first 6,000 years and the Millennium (Rev 20:1-6). They will appear before the throne of God at the time of the last judgment (Rev 20:11-15).

The determination of the beginnings of the month ([new light](#)) on the basis of the visible moon surface over Jerusalem (see timeanddate.com): **1st month Nisan 5783**: March 22, 2023 (0.7%), March 23 (4%); **2nd month Iyar**: April 20 (0.1%), April 21 (2%), April 22 (6.2%); **3rd month Sivan**: May 19 (0.1%), May 20 (0.7%), May 21 (3.5%); **5th month Av**: July 19 (2.8%), July 20 (6.8%); **7th month Tishrei 5784**: Sept 15 (0.2%), Sept 16 (1.8%), Sept 17 (5.3%). **In 2024: 1st month Nisan 5784** (God's calendar): March 11, 2024 (1.8%), March 12 (6.6%), but in the Jewish calendar there is a leap year at the beginning of 2024, so the 1st month starts one month later: 1st month Nisan 5784 (Jewish calendar): April 9, 2024 (0.7%), April 10 (4.2%).

The biblical month always begins with the first visible crescent moon (new light) over Jerusalem and has either 29 or 30 days

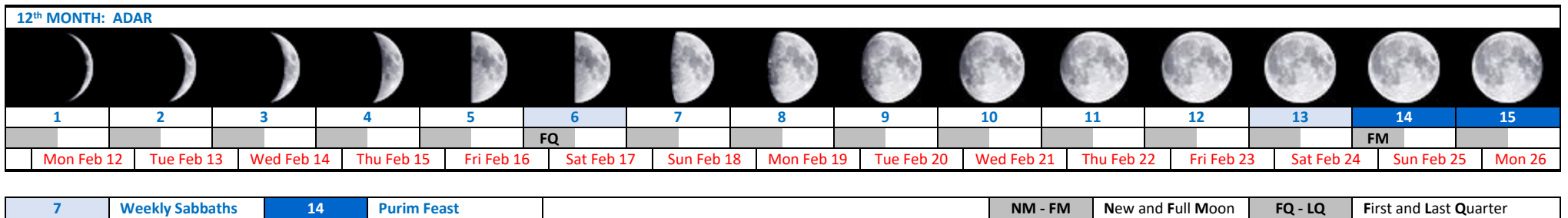
ADDITIONAL FEAST DAYS IN ISRAEL 2023

In addition to the 7 annual or high feast Sabbaths, which were ordered by God as early as the time of Moses, there are other feast days in Israel that came into being over the following centuries as a result of special historical events. The most important are **Tisha B'Av** (Day of Great Mourning) on the 9th of Av in the 5th month of the biblical year, and **Tu B'Av** (Day of Joy, Feast of the Wedding) on the 15th of Av. On this night of the full moon (14/15th of Av), the virgins of Israel went to the vineyards to find a bridegroom while singing and dancing. It was the end of the wheat harvest and the end of the Pentecost season, because from that time the harvest of the autumn fruits (grape harvest) began. In 2023, the feast days in the 5th month of Av fall on the same days in both calendars, but in the Jewish calendar it is the 11th month. The **Feast of Purim** (Day of Joy, Feast of Lot, Feast of Salvation) is at the end of a biblical year, i.e., in the 12th or 13th month (leap year), and in 2024 it even falls on different months in both calendars because the Jewish calendar inserts a leap month. Therefore, the Jews celebrate the Passover 2024 (24.04) too late, because the barley would have already fallen to the ground at that time and the firstfruits sheaf could not have been offered in the Jerusalem temple.

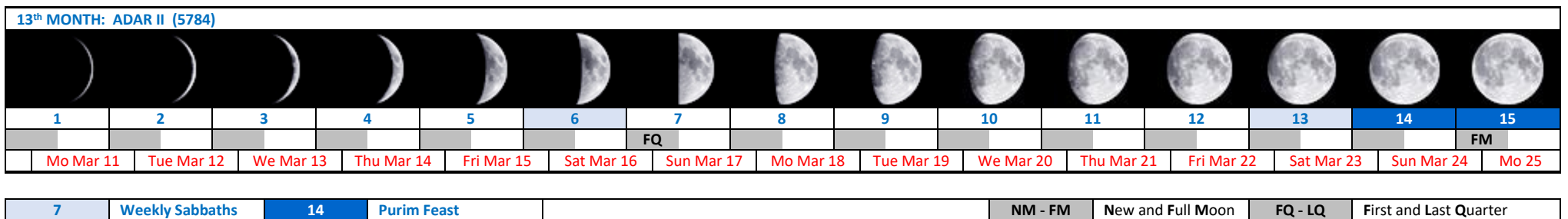

The table above shows the 7 feast days (High Sabbaths) according to the biblical astronomical calendar of God (e.g. TorahCalendar) and the inaccurate mathematical *Jewish calendar* (italics). In 2020, both calendars fell on the same days. In some years there are big differences, because the leap years (red) with an additional 13th month in the *Jewish calendar* are often not calculated correctly (2021, 2024, 2027, 2030). In God's calendar, the spring and fall feasts are always near the equinox (March 19-21 and September 22-24), but in the *Jewish calendar* they are often a month later. God's calendar, described in Leviticus 23, is an astronomical and agricultural calendar in which the ripeness of the early grain (barley) determines the beginning of the first month of the year, so that the firstfruits sheaf (Omer) can always be offered on Passover.

In 2020, 2023, 2026, 2027, and 2030, the 14th of Nisan falls on a Wednesday in the *Jewish calendar*, as it did in the year Jesus was crucified.
